How To Register

Resident/Non-Resident

For **program enrollment**, Residents are those that reside within the Middleton-Cross Plains School District boundaries. Non-Residents are those that are not part of the school district.

1) Internet Registration

To Register Online: By using the online system, registration will be available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Registration will be done through **RecDesk**. To find the activities you want to register for, go to our website at www.cityofmiddleton.us and hover over "I Want To", click "Register for Recreation Programs" to access the RecDesk site. Not all classes or programs may be available for online registration.

What's My Password? If you plan on registering online and have forgotten your login or password, please DO NOT create a new account! Call or email us prior to registering to reset your login or password.

Confirming Residency Status: Those who do not live within the 53562 zip code, but reside within the school district boundaries, must contact us prior to registering to manually set-up your account and to adjust your residency status to "resident." If you do not contact us ahead of time to adjust your account, the system will charge you as a non-resident and non-resident fees will not be refunded.

Confirmations: Once you complete and registration and have paid with a credit card, you will receive an email confirmation. Please open this receipt to confirm registration details are correct. No other confirmations or reminders will be sent to you.

2) Walk-In (7426 Hubbard Avenue)

Walk in registration for all programs will be accepted beginning the dates listed and will continue until classes are filled. **We do not accept phone registrations.**

Credit Card Payment

All credit card payments, including online payments, **are charged a non-refundable processing fee.**

Late Registrations

Late registrations will not be accepted, unless approved by the Recreation Supervisor. **Registration deadlines are important, so please register early!** They help us purchase supplies, apparel, and assign staff prior to the program start.

Refunds

Full refunds will be made on all classes that are cancelled by the Recreation Division. Full refunds will be honored for any written request made a minimum of one week prior to the start of the class or program. Credit Card processing fees are non-refundable. Refunds will not be issued for unattended classes, weather related cancellations, or holiday dates. A \$5.00 service charge is withheld for all refunds, unless the activity is cancelled by the Recreational Division. **There will be no refunds issued once the program starts.** Participants who miss classes due to illness, vacations, etc., will not be provided the opportunity to make them up.

Transfers

Transfers between classes must be done within a minimum of one week prior to the start of a class. After that time, transfers will not be accepted.

Min/Max Enrollment

Middleton Recreation will determine the minimum number of participants needed to hold the program, and reserves the right to cap enrollment when deemed necessary. **If the minimum number for a program is not met one week prior to the program start date, the program will be cancelled.**

Program Postponements/Inclement Weather

Any program postponed due to inclement weather will not be rescheduled. The Middleton Recreation Division will post messages for all programs in case of inclement weather. If MCPASD closes, no programs will be held at the schools and the Youth Center will be closed. If you would like more information about a possible cancellations or postponements, check the Department's Facebook Page or call the Recreation **HOTLINE at 608-821-8357.**

Confirmation of Enrollment

Once you have registered, plan on attending at the listed times and dates. Please feel free to call to verify your enrollment and/or ask questions. The Recreation Division will only contact you if the program is full, cancelled, or there are changes.

Age/Grade Requirements

All youth programs ages restrictions will be based on the first day of the program. All grade restrictions will be based on the current school year. Age and grade requirements are set to benefit all children and to make instruction easier for the program leader. All participants must register for the correct class or they may be contacted to move classed or lose their spot in the program.

EAB & Middleton – What You Need To Know



The Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) is an exotic invasive beetle that is significantly impacting the city's urban forest.

Background

During the summer of 2009, Wachtel Tree Science, Inc. conducted an ash tree inventory and identified 2,335 ash trees along streets, as well as an additional 261 ash trees on public lands (parks and Pleasant View Golf course). This translates to roughly 28% of the city street trees being ash – well above the desired urban forestry guideline of 20% for any genus and 10% for any one tree species.

Removal of ash trees

The City has been conducting removal of ash trees on public property since 2010, and replanting with a high diversity of tree species whenever possible. Starting in 2014, removals have been based on positive identification of EAB in each tree. The goal is to remove infected trees as soon as they are identified to help keep the beetle population as low as possible, thus slowing the spread of EAB.


Last winter (2016) showed a dramatic increase in EAB throughout Middleton.

What can I do about ash on my private property?

Monitor your trees' health and watch for signs and symptoms, such as dieback in the upper tree top and woodpecker feeding – especially from January through April.

Understand chemical treatment options and costs. The best way to determine if treatment is a good option for you is to contact a qualified contractor and get an assessment of your tree(s). At the same time, the contractor can give you a removal estimate to further help determine whether or not to treat your tree.



Cross Country Ski Trails



The City of Middleton offers ski trails at Pleasant View Golf Course (4279 Pleasant View Rd) and Lakeview Park (6300 Mendota Ave). Trails are groomed for both skating and diagonal striding. Grooming for skating can be done with a minimum of 2 inches of snow, depending on the base established. Trails are groomed Mondays and Fridays, weather permitting.

The Lakeview Park Trail is a beginner trail and is one-third of a mile. The Pleasant View Golf Course has four loop trails, with varying degrees of difficulty, and distances up to two and one half miles. The Clubhouse at Pleasant View Golf Course maybe open periodically as a warming house. Signs will be posted when the Clubhouse is open.
